

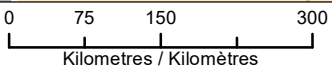
Aklavik
Flooding is still ongoing
To date, 166 residents have been evacuated to Inuvik
Erosion-related damage is suspected for the airstrip
Emergency response costs are associated with the transport and care of all 166 evacuees

Fort Good Hope
9 homes and 1 hotel were affected
2 households remain uninhabitable
Emergency response costs were associated with caring for residents evacuated to higher-lying parts of the town, electrical inspection of structures and long term accomodation for 2 households

Fort Simpson
Some damage occurred to structures, including the health clinic, federal buildings and some homes
All residents were able to return to their homes after the flood risk passed
Emergency response costs were associated with the transport and care of 128 residents evacuated to Fort Smith and Hay River

Jean Marie River
Damage to structures, including airstrip, power plant, communication infrastructure and health clinic
Approximately 26 homes remain uninhabitable
Emergency response costs were associated with the transport of 39 residents evacuated to Fort Providence and more than 80 residents staying in tents nearby
The territory is working to provide longer term housing for the approximately 80 residents whose homes remain uninhabitable, with discussions about potentially relocating the entire community

Hay River and K'atlodeeche
Some evacuations cost and minimal recovery costs are anticipated
All residents were able to return to their homes after the flood risk passed
